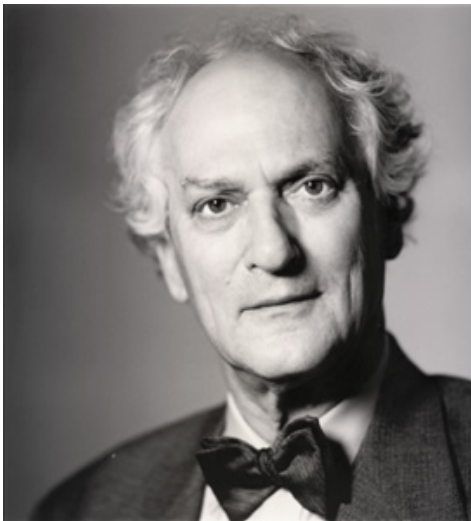


Eric Cassell, MD, M.A.C.P.
